The list below would be considered a basic or limited palette. Some people might say that you need a cool red and a warm red, a cool yellow and warm yellow, a cool and warm blue, and will advise against black and suggest using Burnt Umber instead. I have no problem with that, but personally, I see no reason to avoid black. I also think that only one of each primary color is actually necessary to get started.
